### SCHOLARSHIPS

#### Important Information

Does your family qualify for class scholarships? Yes! Every applicant receives a class scholarship equal to 10%-100% of the class price. Scholarships are awarded on a sliding scale based on your family's adjusted gross income; the number of dependents in the family; whether you rent or own your home; whether you are a single parent; and how many children in your family plan to take classes.

For example, Mr. and Mrs. Smith apply for a scholarship for their daughter, Sally. Their adjusted gross income is \$40,000. They own their home and have three children. They will receive a 25%-30% scholarship on a \$100 class. That's a savings of \$25-\$30. If all three of their children plan to take a \$100 class they will receive a 30%-35% scholarship for a savings of \$90-\$105.

It is very important to the Center for the Arts of Bonita Springs that all area children have access to the many programs and activities the Center offers. Please call the Art Center today to receive a scholarship application so your child can attend dance, theater or art classes.

## 2-D Sampler

A great class filled with interesting projects designed to introduce your child to a variety of mediums. Sample clay, painting, and more. New projects each week.

## Anything but Flat

Who needs flat when you can build 3D art! Explore different materials like paper, clay and anything else you can get your hands on! Students will design and construct sculptures, learn composition, and be inspired by architecture, trees, animals and people. Have fun exploring the technical aspects of design.

## Cartooning

Cartoons are such fun and there are several different types. Create simple line drawing comics or more elaborately decorative cartoons. Learn to develop a character and keep the heart of your cartoon alive in a series of cartoons. Each week will introduce a new facet of cartooning.

## Clay I

Oh, the wonderful things you can do with a lump of clay! Mold it into imaginary creatures or build a treasure chest—make beads or create a one-of-a-kind vase. Learn the basics of hand building with clay and see where it leads you.

## Cookonomics

Move over Emeril! Here comes the next generation of celebrity chefs. In this scrumptious course, children learn about the preparation and business of food from selection of ingredients to catering to cooking shows, restaurants, cookbooks and candy factories. They will design menus, experiment with foods and recipes—even produce a class cookbook!

## Digital Photo & Downloads

Explore digital photography. Take photos and learn to download them to a computer for cropping, lightening, and a variety of computer enhancements. Great class for budding photographers and computer savvy teens.

## Drawing & Painting for High School Students

This course is designed to introduce the fundamentals of traditional drawing and painting. Students will explore various forms of drawing and learn basics such as measuring, value and perspective while working in an encouraging atmosphere. Students will work from life and photographs to study different subject matter including still life, portrait and landscape.

## Eager Engineers

Build on fun and excitement—develop your engineering skills. From bridges to skyscrapers and domes to balloon driven cars. Learn about simple machines and robots. This class is as educational as it is exciting and forms a strong foundation for new ideas.

## Earth Explorers

Is there anything cooler than an up-close look at the wonders of nature? Join our detective team as we uncover the secrets and learn about the complex world of plants, animals, and habitats that make up our earth. Hands on projects include tracking dinosaurs, building a volcano, ant architecture, and unique nature projects.

## Eco is Green

Green art is an exciting exploration of environmentally friendly materials and subjects. Campers will create fun art projects from found objects, re-used and recycled materials, and natural, hand-made materials. This is what being creative is all about!

# Descriptions-Visual Arts Classes

## Global Explorers

All aboard! Have your tickets ready to cross vast oceans and visit wild and exotic lands. The around the world journey includes stops in 14 countries on 7 continents. Students will visit famous sites and historic moments, collecting souvenirs, photos and other mementos. Students will explore cultures and art forms such as: Egyptian hieroglyphics, pyramids; Italian murals, aqueducts and frescoes; Chinese kites, marbled paper, sumi-e painting...and much more.

## Mix It Up

Absolutely everything! This is a class for expressing yourself through drawing, painting, collage and sculpture, too.

## Mommy & Me

Introduce your child to the wonderful world of art and build lasting memories as you and your child explore new projects each week.

## Painting & Beyond

A fun experimental class for young artists. Learn about famous artists and create works of art with a variety of artistic methods and materials.

## Print Making & Silk-Screening

Welcome to the world of print making. Students will work on a variety of projects starting with the basics—create a plate, ink the plate, place on paper, apply pressure. You have a truly lasting impression.

## PMC Metal/Clay Jewelry

Great fun with beginning students exploring the amazing things that can be created with precious metal clay. Make pendants, charms, beads ... mold clay into your own special object. The last two days of this class will be used to string all PMC objects with other commercial beads and create wearable art.

## Teen Glass Fusing

Learn about basic design and color with fused glass. Create a variety of pieces while learning about different tools, techniques and safety.

## Totally Art

Everything and the kitchen sink! A camp for expressing yourself through drawing, painting, collage and a bit of sculpture, too.

## Wheel Throwing Pottery

Sitting at the potter's wheel and forming a spectacular bowl or vase is very gratifying. Students learn to block clay and throw on the wheel. Pieces are finished with colorful glazes for a professional look.

## Young at Art

Painting, drawing, clay, collage...there are so many things to explore in the world of art! Each week new projects designed with young artists in mind. Loads of fun and lots of encouragement!





## Acting for TV & Film

Aspiring actors and actresses ages 7 and up will learn the art of auditioning for TV and film roles. They will also learn a monologue or be paired up with another student their age for a scene. Everything will be filmed and viewed to learn from with a final copy to take home at the end of the session.

## Acting 101

Students ages 7-10 receive a great introduction to the world of plays and musical theatre. The class explores the world of theater through improv games and imagination exercises while learning to sing, dance and act on the stage. At the end of each five-week session, there is a mini-show complete with simple costuming, sound and lights.

## Acting 102

This class is for students age eleven and up, who want to learn more about the art of acting. The class will explore drama through improv games, monologues and scenes. Each student will be assigned a scene or monologue to memorize and present. At the end of each five week session there is a performance complete with simple costuming, sound and lights. (Acting 101 NOT required) Ages 11 and up.

## Clay Animation

Exciting class combines fun, hands-on art activities in the creation of an animated movie. You will use your imagination and ideas to create characters, background, props, sound and storyboard. Then learn how to “shoot” your movie. Who knows, maybe you’re the next Steven Spielberg! Even if you’re not, you’ll have a great time.

## Costume Design

Learn to recycle and use materials for art to make costumes rather than throwing them away. All costumes will be used in the production of Beauty and the Beast at the Promenade May 25th and 26th, 2012.

## Improv Workshop I

Come learn games and techniques that you’ve seen on TV and that actors use every day to save a scene. This class is for those who like shows like “Whose Line is it Anyway?” The skills are great for the theater and public speaking. Ages 12-18.

## Movie Makers

AND...the Oscar goes to you! If you’ve ever wanted to see your face on the big screen, then this is the class for you. You’ll act in your own short film and learn to edit it, too!

## Set Design

Learn to recycle and use materials for art to make sets and props rather than throwing them away. All sets and props will be used in the production of Beauty and the Beast at the Promenade May 25th and 26th, 2012.

## Showbiz

Take a ride on a magic carpet and broaden your imagination with this beginning drama course. Learn theater games, create your own fairytale and make your stage debut. This class is for ages 4 to 6. Showbiz students will put on a short performance at the end of the session, complete with music, lights and costumes.

# Descriptions-Dance Classes

## **Ballet**

Ballet class introduces the different sections of a traditional ballet class and expands on basic ballet vocabulary. Dancers will continue to build skills to improve flexibility, coordination, technique and body awareness.

## **Ballet Fairytales**

Specially designed class for the littlest ballerinas! Learn the stories of traditional ballet history and even reenact some of them. Props, music and costuming will be used to further enhance the experience. Dancers will get to see how classic stories like Cinderella and Sleeping Beauty can be expressed through the magical world of ballet.

## **Broadway Dance**

Explore the many styles of Broadway through musical numbers from Chicago, West Side Story and Little Shop of Horrors! Through these musical numbers, students will learn dance steps, terminology and techniques that are specific to Broadway dance.

## **Creative Movement**

A wonderful introduction to movement and dance class. Children will learn social skills, basic locomotor movements and introductory ballet terminology through creative play and guided exercises. "Props" are incorporated to help little ones stay focused and have fun learning!

## **Dance Around the World**

Get a dance experience from different cultures around the world. Each week the class will work on a new style. Learn Polynesian, Bollywood, Salsa, African, Thai and more!

## **Jazz/Hip Hop**

Fun and energetic classes that utilizes various forms of jazz dance as well as the ever popular Hip Hop dance styles to introduce new and innovative movements as well as some classics. Students will learn basic exercises, steps, and choreography to build skills in this genre.

## **Performance Dance**

Dancers will have the opportunity to work as a solo, duet or group, creating a dance piece from their style of interest including, Jazz, Modern, Ballet or Broadway.

## **Technique/Jazz**

Dancers will explore basic to advanced techniques in ballet, modern and jazz, which they will then apply in a jazz dance routine.

**Drop off procedure:** On the first day of class, parents/guardians will be told where their child's classroom is located and children may be dropped off at the classrooms for the rest of the course session.

**Pick up procedure:** Pick up is promptly at the end of your program time, at your child's assigned classroom space. Please be here at the appointed time, we do not have the facilities or personnel to care for your child when he/she is not in class.

**For your child's safety:** If the regular parent or guardian will not be picking up your child, please provide advanced signed written permission for the release of your child to another adult's custody. Also please provide signed written permission for the release of your child if she/he is to be allowed to walk or bike home from the Center for the Arts.

**Attendance policy:** If your child is going to be absent, please notify the front desk, 239-495-8989.

**Emergency communication:** If you need to contact your child during a program session, please call the front desk, 239-495-8989.

**Medications, First Aid and Safety:** If your child needs to take a prescribed medication, please see our front desk personnel. Medications will be kept under lock and key and dispensed by a staff member according to parent/guardian's written instructions.

**Toilet Training Policy:** It is our policy that all children must be toilet trained before entering programs (Mommy & Me class is the only exception). This also means no Pull Ups. Children must be able to clean themselves without teacher assistance. If your child has a bowel movement or urinates in his/her pants during class you will be called to come and clean your child and provide clean clothes. Please know that this is for health, safety and legal concerns to protect both your child and the teacher.
